Safe Sharps Information Sheet

WHAT ARE SHARPS?

Sharps is a medical term for a device with sharp points or edges that can cut skin. They include: Needles, syringes, lancets/fingerstick devices, auto injectors (including epinephrine and insulin pens), infusion sets, connection needles /sets

HOW DO I DISPOSE OF SHARPS SAFELY?

If you live in Nova Scotia follow this procedure to dispose of sharps safely:

- 1. Pick up a free Safe Sharps container at any local pharmacy.
- 2. Place used sharps into the Safe Sharps container.
- 3. When the container is full, return the sealed container to your local pharmacy. and pick up a new container if necessary.

Residents living outside of Nova Scotia should contact their local municipality to learn how to dispose of sharps safely in their area.

WHAT DO I DO IF I ENCOUNTER A LITTERED SHARP?

Do not pick up the sharp, take note of the location of the sharp and contact your local waste management facility or local RCMP for instruction.

WHAT DO I DO IF I GET PRICKED BY A SHARP?

- 1. Allow the wound to bleed freely
- 2. Wash with soap and water
- 3. Apply sterile waterproof bandage
- 4. Seek immediate medical attention by calling your physician or going to the hospital.
